Acceptable use and conditions:

I will:		
	protect my password	
	only use my allocated device, only for my learning and tasks set by the teacher	
	only use any device with the permission of a teacher	
	only use the internet with the permission of a teacher	
	follow all instructions from teachers when using school devices	
	tell the teacher immediately if I think someone is using my account	
	tell the teacher immediately if there is damage to my allocated device	
	tell the teacher immediately if I see someone using a device irresponsibly	
	tell the teacher immediately if I see any information on the device that is not acceptable in a school environment	
	only connect any ICT device to the school network with staff permission,	
	only browse or search appropriate websites	
	only use material from Internet sites or other sources I have permission to do so	
	reference pictures and material I download from the Internet	
	handle all devices with care	
	make sure that any comments that I post or any work that I wish to have published is respectful, carefully written and well presented	
	maintain personal safety and privacy while accessing the Internet	
	ask the teacher if I am unsure about anything involving ICT usage	
	maintain personal safety and privacy while accessing the Internet.	
<u>I will not:</u>		
	use school ICT equipment until my parents/caregivers and I have signed the ICT User agreement	
	let other people log-on to my account and I will not log-on to other people's accounts	
	give out my last name, phone number, address, photographs or other details about myself or others	
	interfere with other people's work, which may result in it being changed, vandalised, lost or deleted	
	touch or unplug computer cords and cables such as keyboard/mouse cables or power cords	
	use any device to be mean, rude or unkind about other people or that violates the privacy of others online	
	bring or download any movies, music and images that are not used for school work	
	store personal or confidential information on any device	
	create, transmit or knowingly receive; offensive, obscene, or indecent document or images.
